


### Doing their temple work -





To request a temple ordinance go to the person's page and click the ordinance icon.

After that's done this is the page to request the ordinance, print it out and take it to the temple to exchange for a card to carry with you during a session.








RootsSearch Extension in Chrome is a great tool. Your ward or stake family history consultant can probably show you how to set it up and use it. Saves a lot of typing time in adding sources that you find.

Or you can try it yourself:

3 menu bars = at top right>
settings> extensions> chrome
apps> type rootssearch in
search box at top left > enable

It will show icon in a few minutes.

Other times it might not show but you can click where it should be and it will work.
